Students win ₹1.6L worth cash prizes for startup ideas

Trichy: The startup mela organised by the St Joseph's Institute of Management to promote entrepreneurship skills among youths and students of business schools saw around seven teams with startup ideas grabbing cash prizes worth ₹1.6 lakh. A total of 334 students from various business schools across India took part in the event on Friday.

In the preliminary round, a total of 33 teams were scrutinised for their startup proposals, market credibility, viability of the proposal and sustainability. Six teams were selected for the finals.

king professional received first prize for his business idea to produce an air cooler used for both hot and cold conditions. He was awarded ₹50,000 as a cash prize. A team from K J Somaiya College of Engineering, Mumbai got the second prize of ₹30,000 for designing a wheelchair with an assisting arm for people with disabilities.

Students of Holy Cross College, Trichy won the third prize of ₹20,000 for designing an ultrasonic location detector to help the visually impaired access public places independently. Two students — Carlyne Kavya and Naveen N M from St Joseph's Institute of Management who had designed smartwatch for ensuring women's safety were awarded best submission under the innovation category and a cash prize of ₹10,000 by the CII Young Indian Trichy chapter.

Three teams from St Joseph's Institute of Management received total cash prizes worth ₹50,000 for their business ideas.
